A Message from the Board Chair & Executive Director

This past year 2020/2021 has been unlike any other in the history of our organization. The Covid-19 pandemic affected all aspects of our operations. Zoom became a verb as it replaced of our face-to-face contacts Gateway staff and consumers have all adapted in ways that were unanticipated only a few months before. We have, however, survived and thrived not with standing the challenges presented by the pandemic and done our best to keep everyone safe. We have great admiration and appreciation for everyone representing Gateway in the community and serving our consumers.

Several matters are of particular note. During this crisis Gateway was made the lead agency for a significant expansion of homelessness outreach and supportive housing programs in Niagara. As a result of these additional programs and responsibilities, the number of Gateway staff and the size of the budget approximately doubled. In addition, there continued to be progress from the Strategic Alliance project with Mainstream Non Profit Housing Project and Mainstream: An Unsheltered Workshop which allows both agencies to strengthen their ability to serve their consumers in the years ahead.

Gateway was founded in 1986 by family members who saw the need for their loved ones to be able to reside in community based supportive housing. Even as the agency has grown in size of staff, numbers of units and properties, we have continued with the goal of providing housing and the necessary supports in a manner consistent with the needs of our residents, but also very importantly consistent with our consumers' own defined aspirations.

Our consumers are the root motivation for our staff, volunteers and board members and our reward is seeing consumers recover stability and grow and change in ways that they choose.

We are proud of our extremely dedicated, professional and caring staff who make possible our continuing support for each consumer in the manner our consumers both choose and require. A very heartfelt thanks goes out to each of them for their constant care and concern for our consumers in the midst of the pandemic.

Gateway's ability to serve its consumers is dependent upon a substantial number of people and other organizations. In particular, we wish to extend our thanks and appreciation to each and every one of our many volunteers, and to the many other agencies with which we have productive, co-operative, and mutually supportive relationships.

We also look forward to expanding upon the benefits of our relationship with Mainstream, its consumers, staff, and board of directors.








Landlord Engagement Home for Good Owned Units









Gateway - Mainstream Strategic Alliance



In June 2018, Mainstream and Gateway Residential and Community Support Services of Niagara (Gateway) undertook a two-year project to explore the possibility of forming a strategic Alliance. This project was made possible with an Employment and Modernization grant from MCCSS. During the first year of this process, we developed a shared vison and objectives, completed an alignment report, and created future scenarios for how to share resources. In 2019-202, we implemented many of the plans developed in the first year. In June 2020, Kevin Berswick retired, and John Osczypko became the joint executive director of both Mainstream and Gateway.
