A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT PATTY BERARD

As President of the Board of Directors I am proud of the progress and accomplishments that Gateway has made this year. Our programs and services continue to be supported through strong partnerships with community organizations and government agencies as we expand to address the growing needs of our community. Our newest project will revitalize and provide growth with the development of more affordable housing in Niagara Falls.

It is vital that people living with a mental illness have equitable access to affordable, quality housing, along with supports. Offering both housing and support based on their choices should be paramount. Evidence suggests that offering housing choices to people with mental health problems improves stability and mental health. The development of a full range of housing and support options, include supplements and access to scattered site units, allows people to direct their own opportunities and find a place to call home that best suits their needs.

In the 1950's the average hospitalization period for mental health was seven years. In the 1970's it was one and a half years. Now we are down to an average hospitalization period of two weeks. We have pushed deinstutionalization in hopes that the community services would better fit the needs of these people. This is why Gateway is a perfect fit for the community and the people it serves. With a team of dedicated staff who have our program at heart, and really care and respect our clients we are able to provide serves that are based on what they identify as their needs.

We have an amazing staff who give 100% of themselves under the leadership and direction of John Dsczypko. Our Board of Directors and committee members are also an important part, with their commitment to excellence and high standards, together we make an amazing team. Last but not least we would like to thank each and everyone of you for being a part of our Gateway family.









It is important to celebrate the people who share our vision and help us deliver our mission. Gateway Residential and Community Support Services, Donors, Board of Directors, Volunteers, Director, Managers, Staff, and Clients live out our values everyday as we

OPENING NEW DOORS

The Boards of Gateway and of Open Door Concepts have entered into a partnership with the final outcome being that Gateway assumes the assets of Canal View Homes. We have cleared many hurdles and are waiting for final approval from the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing.

On January 1st, 2015 three new affordable housing units were added to 178 King St. Welland.

Gateway entered into a partnership agreement with LEAP Properties and is currently looking at building 9 new units of affordable housing in Niagara Falls.

Gateway is a participant in the Housing First program. This program provides affordable supported housing to 17 individuals who were chronically homeless.


